Review of activities during the last 12 months

Over the last year we have:

- arranged, coordinated and supported the CPD webinar programme for AFSP members and external attendees.
- In 2025 we offered 13 webinars, and 2 AFSP members only webinars.
- We aimed to offer a diversity of topics and presenters, representing areas of interest in the UK and internationally.
- We attended to giving space to marginalised topics and groups.
- We attended to financial viability whilst attempting to offer wide access to AFSP members.
- We linked with other AFSP committees, groups and staff.
- We reviewed feedback, and identified changes e.g. flexibility in length of webinar to incorporate more attendee participation.
- We arranged write-up of webinars in *Context*.
- We supported AFSP conference – planning, providing moderators to online attendees, hosts to workshops.
